Participants can work in groups of up to four people with a staff member that accompanies them at all times. Participants who experience greater independence work without this type of support.

In Goodwill's Supported Employment Services programs, participants work with a job coach, receive job training, and the opportunity to work and earn a paycheck.

For more than 18 years, Goodwill of Orange County has offered Supported Employment Services to meet the needs of people with developmental disabilities in our community. Over the years, the program has grown tremendously. Goodwill has been recognized by funding agencies, community members and employers. The Joy of Getting a Job.


